We have used part of our **Pupil Deprivation Grant** to employ two Learning Support Assistants. Both members of staff have attended the new Catch Up Numeracy training. On completion of training they will be delivering one to one and small group support for targeted pupils. The extra class at Key Stage 2 allows us to create four classes plus support groups enabling pupils to be stretched or supported depending on ability. They will also be trained in Catch Up Literacy reading intervention.
